I hope this letter finds you well. This is a two-week bulletin because of Thanksgiving. First of all, I wish you all a very happy Thanksgiving. Certainly, we are grateful for all the blessings that God has bestowed on us not just on Thanksgiving, but every day. Please know of my prayers for all travelers, and we welcome all of our guests here at St. Mary-Holy Cross.

It is hard to believe but the weekend of the 30th/1st we begin the season of Advent. The Advent season is a time of **preparation** that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas. (excerpt from USCCB Website)



### **Waiting in Joyful Hope**

We are all story-bearers. All of us bear witness to the people, places and experiences that shape our lives. Stories of love and loss. Stories of grief and gratitude. The ordinary moments and the extraordinary ones. Sacred Stories abound. This booklet includes many stores from people, places and experiences that can help us come to know the incarnate Christ more deeply. Each day of the Advent and Christmas seasons pairs a short story with a spiritual reflection, mediation and prayer.

# **Little Blue Book**

Each day we are alive, the Lord wants us to grow closer to Him. This book will help you in your daily prayer for the Advent and Christmas seasons.

Volunteers can pay for the meal themselves, be reimbursed by the parish, or receive a Gift-In-Kind receipt for a tax deduction.
